To recognize Art Wolf, one of the founders of the Nevada Museums Association, we named our annual scholarship for emerging professionals in his honor after his passing in 2021. Art Wolf, founder of Wolf Consulting, was a life-long supporter of and advocate for museums. Through his firm, Wolf led museums and other cultural associations to define and achieve their missions. He was a critical voice to lure the Western Museums Association annual conference to Las Vegas in 2014 during a pivotal moment of rapid museum growth in Southern Nevada.


During his forty-year career, he served on the American Alliance of Museums Board of Directors, Association of Science Museum Directors, and the Board of ICOM-US, the United States affiliate of the International Council of Museums. In 2019, the American Alliance of Museums named him a Star Advocate. We recognize his legacy as an avid attendee, frequent presenter, and supporter of the Nevada Museums Association's annual conference.

Each year, we ask museum members and supporters to donate items for our annual raffle, with all proceeds going towards the scholarship fund to honor Art's legacy. KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Colin Robertson is the Charles N. Mathewson Senior Vice President of Education and Research at Nevada Museum of Art. He leads the education and research functions of the Museum and works to integrate the Museum's research work in the Center for Art + Environment with the Museum's many educational initiatives. He has helped expand and enhance the Museum's school, teacher, and public programs, refine the docent program, shape the Center for Art + Environment and its triennial Art + Environment Conferences, and initiate the ongoing development of the Museum's STEAM education initiatives. Robertson also curated the exhibitions "Modernist Maverick: The Architecture of William L. Pereira" (2013) and "Seeking an Expression of Place: The Architecture of Lake Tahoe," part of the Museum's 2015 encyclopedic survey, Tahoe: A Visual History. Formerly, Robertson was Vice President at Switch, and the founding director of the Nevada Division of Outdoor Recreation, a State agency in the Nevada Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.

The Tonopah Historic Mining Park is located on the site of the original mining claims that started the rush to Tonopah, making it "Queen of the Silver Camps". Jim and Belle Butler's strike in 1900 brought the United States into the 20th Century, and many of the mining processing techniques developed during that time are still being used today. The park encompasses portions of four of the original major mining companies and covers more than 100 acres. This rich history is brought to life through preserved and restored equipment and buildings, historic exhibits, video presentations (in our on-site theater), and a self-guided tour.



Pre-Conference Workshop: Archives 101 for Museum Professionals

In 2023, the Nevada State Historical Records Advisory Board (SHRAB) conducted a statewide needs assessment survey. The majority of survey respondents were individuals working with archival materials in museum settings. To meet some of the needs most frequently expressed by survey respondents, SHRAB will provide a free workshop, "Archives 101 for Museum Professionals," to introduce best practices and standards for caring for paper-based archival materials. The workshop will focus on the fundamentals of archival collection management and basic archival arrangement and description. The workshop will offer some comparison of how approaches to managing objects/artifacts might differ from managing archival collections. The workshop will be structured to allow for instruction, hands-on exercises, and time for participants to brainstorm with instructors on solutions specific to their own environments. The workshop will be presented at no cost to participants. No supplies or previous experience are required. *Pre-registration required - limited to 25 participants*

His "Nevada Ghost Towns & Mining Camps" published in 1970 earned for him the Award of Merit from the American Association of State and Local History. Next came "Northwestern Arizona Ghost Towns" which was followed by "Las Vegas, It Began As It Grew", a definitive history of the formation of Las Vegas. Thereafter came other ghost town guides and town histories on Death Valley, central Arizona, Tonopah and Goldfield, Nevada and finally the definitive "Nevada Annotated Bibliography", a compilation of 2,544 books on the Silver State. In the 1980s author Paher has published more than 75 books for other authors and operates Nevada Publications as a publishing and book distribution service throughout the desert Southwest.
